NO TIME TO DIE WORLD PREMIERE COVID PROTOCOLS

On behalf of EON Productions, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Pictures and Universal Pictures International, we are really excited to be hosting the World Premiere of 'No Time To Die' at the Royal Albert Hall on the 28th September. We recognise that for some of you this will be the first public event that you may have attended for more than a year but please be assured that we have worked closely with the Royal Albert Hall and our suppliers, and together have taken a number of measures to ensure a safe and enjoyable evening. All guests are required to monitor their own general health and circumstances before committing to attending the premiere. This may include consideration of the health or vulnerability of members of their household and family and other guests.

You can help make the event safe by:

- We will not be allowing entry to the event without proof of a negative Lateral Flow Test or PCR test taken within 48 hours before the event, reported here
- · All guests should be fully vaccinated where possible, but proof of vaccination alone will not secure your entry to this event.
- · Once you have registered your test result you will receive a text message or email of confirmation which must be shown to our staff on arrival.
- · We suggest that you screen shot the result on your phone ensuring the date of the test is clearly visible, or print it out.
- Rapid lateral flow tests can be collected from most pharmacies or ordered free of charge here
- Parents or guardians of those under 18 will be asked to show proof of a negative test result on their behalf.

All guests will be required to comply with these measures and unfortunately, without the above evidence, you will not be able to attend the premiere.

- If you are travelling from abroad to attend the premiere, you will need to have complied with all the necessary entry requirements which can be found <u>here</u> before arrival at the Royal Albert Hall. This includes receipt of all PCR test results and completing any isolation period. Please be aware that the entry requirements to the UK are reviewed regularly and subject to change at short notice.
- We strongly encourage all guests to wear face coverings both on the red carpet and throughout the Royal Albert Hall. Although this isn't compulsory, please be considerate of other guests. Face masks will be available at all entry points.
- If you feel unwell on the day of the Premiere, we ask you not to attend. Please contact the source of your tickets so they can be reallocated or refunded. Please remember that the earliest symptom of Covid can be a simple sore throat.
- Entry to the RAH can be via the Red Carpet, but other doors at the RAH will be open, so there is no need to queue and walk the red carpet - which will be busy - if you would prefer not to.

What we're doing in addition:

- · Staff working at the Premiere will be wearing face coverings, will have taken a Lateral Flow test 48 hours before starting work, and signed a health declaration form stating that they feel well.
- · Bag searches will be carried out in a contactless way by asking you to remove any items from your bag so that the security team can see there are no restricted items inside.
- There will be contactless hand sanitising stations throughout the building. We encourage everyone to wash and/or sanitise their hands wherever possible during their visit.
- The Royal Albert Hall is fed by filtered fresh air thanks to a newly completed ventilation renovation project. Used air is extracted to the outside and is not recirculated. Filters are changed as part of regular, routine maintenance and the air system is fully controlled throughout the auditorium.
- The Hall has a rigorous cleaning regime in place, in accordance with government guidelines, using hospitalgrade virucidal products both in the auditorium and other parts of the building throughout the day. The seats will be cleaned before and after the premiere.

Any updates to the above will be sent out with your tickets.
